Deaf Reach Schools & Training Centers

Karachi - Hyderabad - Sukkur - Lahore



Over 9 million people in Pakistan (5% of pop.) suffer some form of hearing loss. 1.5 million children are profoundly deaf and cannot attend mainstream schools, yet have little or no educational opportunities. Education equals empowerment. Deaf Reach Schools (DRS) and Deaf Reach Training Centers (DRTC) offer a unique opportunity for this underserved sector of our society.

Mentoring Program

Senior deaf students began a unique internship program working as teacher's assistants in the morning, then continuing their personal studies in the afternoon. This "peer learning" has had a very positive impact on the younger children, and provides the internees a career opportunity to ultimately become a teacher of the Deaf, thus building capacity in the country to help meet this great need.





Teacher Training Program

Deaf Empowerment

Annual teacher training workshops were held in December and July for all DRS teachers from Sukkur, Hyderabad, Karachi and Lahore.

Of 72 fulltime teachers, 65% are deaf themselves, with 30 new teachers having been added to the total staff in this past year.

Deaf Reach Schools and Training Centers provide an enabling environment where the Deaf can receive a quality education and excel in a variety of skills. The majority of students come from low income families and receive free education, transport and all amenities.



Benazir Bhutto Shaheed Youth Development Program (BBSYDP)

A 6 month, in-house training program held at DRTC in Karachi, Hyderabad and Sukkur. 195 deaf men and women age 16 to 26 received training in marketable skills in:

- Teacher Training
- Stitching/Embroidery
- IT skills
- Culinary Arts
- Language Skills: English, Urdu, Sign Language

Deaf Reach - Sukkur

Opened in March 2010 in partnership with the Planning and Development Dept., Government of Sindh, the school is now operating at full capacity with 310 students, and 125 more on a waiting list for admissions!

Children are provided academic and vocational training, lunch and

transport. Students come daily from a 40 km. radius including Shikarpur, Pano Aquil, Khairpur, Luqman, Piryalo, Pir Jo Goth and Rohri .

Opening Soon 1st School for Deaf Children in Baltistan!

Undeterred by the distance or obstacles, Afzal, Aniqa, and their 3 children travelled to Karachi from their village at the base of K2 near Skardu to seek an education for Nargis, their 5 yr. old deaf daughter. She has been happily enrolled in Deaf Reach School for this past year, while Afzal entered the DRS teacher training program and Aniqa completed her Masters degree in education.

In collaboration with FESF they will now return to Baltistan and open a Deaf Reach School, making education possible for hundreds of deaf children in that region.

Community Services

Social uplift and assistance is provided to improve the quality of life for those less fortunate due to disability or other personal hardship.

FESF Summer Camp

The 13th annual FESF Summer Camp, "Creative Caravan", was held in July with support of HSBC's "Education Program" and "Future First!" 175 orphan children from SOS Village, Malir and 1,000 children in pediatric wards of the National Institute of Child Health (NICH) and Fatimid Foundation enjoyed daily recreational and vocational activities.

• 55 student volunteers and 17 youth from SOS Village attended a preliminary 2 week training program wherein they planned the camp activities.

• SOS Village housemothers received training in etiquette/grooming, child care and cooking.

• The Camp included theme-based activities such as care of the environment, ocean exploration, cultures around the world, superheroes, sports, etc.

- Educational Play Therapy and Awareness Programs were conducted at two hospitals in pediatric wards.
- · Excursions and special events were enjoyed by all.



Children's Benefit Concert

FESF organized its 11th Annual "Children's Benefit Concert" on March 17th at the PAF Museum grounds, sponsored by National Bank of Pakistan (NBP) and co-sponsored by Makro, Airlift Int'I, PIA, and LOTTE-PPTA.

• The VIP guests were 5,000 underprivileged and special needs children from 38 institutions and schools.

• The 3 hour live concert featured guest artists Najam Sheraz, Shazia Khushk and her troupe, and HeartBeat!

• 15 deaf students from Deaf Reach School performed a heart-touching dance interpretation of "Taare Zameen Par."

• 100 student volunteers served all the children snacks, cold drinks and ice cream during the concert.

• Each child received a gift bag with stationery, food and clothing items, as well as a healthy boxed lunch from KFC!

Community Projects

As a result of the Motivated Volunteer Empowerment Program (MOVE), the following community projects were organized.

Hospital Uplift Program: Colorful murals painted in pediatric ward of National Liaquat Hospital; Educational Play Therapy conducted at Indus Hospital, NICH, and Fatimid Foundation.

Education: Tutoring and theme-based activities organized for 800 children at Rahnuma School, Bulandi School, Ebrahim Ali Bhai Govt. School.

Environmental Projects: Filmed a documentary on water and electricity conservation; Donated plants/trees to SOS Village; Assisted at WWF carnival; Cleaned up and installed taps/bulbs in public places in Sukkur.

Library: New libraries were set up at Safia Khan Memorial Girls Secondary School and Rahnuma School reaching 750 students.

In-kind Assistance: Donations of clothes, medicine, food, toys to less privileged schools and hospitals in Karachi and Sukkur.



Educational Development Program

The mandate of the Eduserve Program is to strengthen the educational infrastructure by training teachers, administrators, parents and youth.

Master Trainer Program

Partnering with NOWPDP (Network of Organizations Working for Disabilities, Pakistan), FESF continued the training program for parents and teachers from special education and inclusive schools.

- 397 teachers from 49 schools were trained in Karachi; 37 teachers in Islamabad; 22 teachers in Sukkur.
- The initial training focused on Early Reading Skills, an innovative technique used to stimulate reading in young children.
- The 2nd training phase has now begun with the course "Behavior Management for Children with Special Needs."

Childhood Development Programs

Courses were conducted for 325 teachers and educators across Karachi in mainstream and special needs schools. Courses included workshops on Early Childhood Development, Classroom Management, Emotional/Social Intelligence, Instructional Techniques, Behavior Management and Groups Management.



MOVE Motivational Volunteer Empowerment Program

A human development program focusing on soft skills, leadership and volunteerism, empowering the participants to make a positive impact in the community.

MOVE

• 15 MOVE courses were conducted for 441 participants impacting on 40,000 beneficiaries via the Community Projects initiated.

• 33 community service projects were planned and implemented in hospitals, underprivileged schools, orphanages and institutes. Projects focused on education, health, environment, life skills and event management.

• A special MOVE course was held at IBA, Sukkur for 45 participants who then implemented 5 community projects.
